- Improved cabins, trails, campgrounds, restored watersheds to improve salmon habitat & supported youth engagement
- Provided grants to local nonprofits & Tribes
- Contracting and project management for the Forest Service





- Repairing 10 existing cabins
- 2023 2026 timeframe
