

Denali Borough Community Outdoor Recreation Plan (2022-present)

- RTCA is providing technical assistance to the Denali Borough and its partners for the creation of the Denali Borough Community Outdoor Recreation Plan.
- To date, Borough staff have stood up a multi-disciplinary committee who steers the writing of this plan and represents a diverse cross-section of the population.
- RTCA facilitates meetings, holds planning workshops, assists in the creation of surveys and helps create a public outreach plan for the Borough.






Homer Library Placemaking (2021-present)

- The Friends of the Homer Library applied for technical assistance to re-envision a 2.5 acre parcel adjacent to the beloved Homer Public Library.
- 10+ partnering organizations were involved in a two-year collaborative planning process culminating in a conceptual site plan in 2023.
- The community-based planning process included regular meetings, site assessment and surveys, placemaking workshops facilitated in partnership with the Alaska Chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects, public open houses, and engagement with youth at the Library.







Anchorage Outdoor School* (2018)

- The Anchorage Outdoor School (AOS) mission is to cultivate lifelong stewardship of public lands in Alaska through residential, place based outdoor education for fifth graders. It's an example of an RTCA project focused on youth educational programming and stewardship.
- RTCA supported a multi-agency effort of 10+ organizations to develop two pilot programs at the Chugach National Forest's Begich, Boggs Visitor Center in Portage in 2019.
- RTCA supported organizational capacity building efforts to make this a sustainable program. The program is now led by the Kenai Mountains-Turnagain Arm National Heritage Area.
