#### **Brief Project Description:**

Construct switchbacks connecting Gruening Middle School to Chugach State Park and the Lower Eagle River Trail for youth and community park access.

#### **Explanation of Other Funds:**

Chugach Mountain Bike Riders, 501(c)3 has already funded and completed trail assessment by Interior Trails and construction cost estimates by Happy Trails, both Alaska members of the Professional Trail Builders Association.

#### **Detailed Project Description and Justification:**

This project will construct approximately one mile of new switchbacks and connecting trail from Gruening Middle School, located on the ridge above the river, to the existing Lower Eagle River Trail at the valley bottom.

Gruening Middle School borders Chugach State Park overlooking the Eagle River Valley. Currently there is no public access to this swath of public land. Access to the park is blocked by a chain link fence due to a steep ravine leading down to the river. Design work has been completed to construct a series of switchbacks that would connect the middle school and surrounding neighborhoods to a network of trails along the river itself.

This trail would be nonmotorized multiuse, as called for in the Chugach State Park Trails Plan, open to hikers, bikers, skiers, etc. It has the support of the Chugach State Park Citizen's Advisory Board, as well as Eagle River and Eagle River Valley Community Councils.

The Lower Eagle River Trail forms the backbone of the Eagle River Greenbelt trail system, parallels the Historic Iditarod Trail and is identified as a possible braid of the Alaska Long Trail. This access trail will provide a connection from the Glenn Hwy Pathway to Gruening Middle School and access upriver neighborhoods and trails.

Chugach Mountain Bike Riders, 501(c)3, has been building and advocating for multiuse trails and pathways in Chugiak-Eagle River since 2017, and currently grooms and maintains the Lower Eagle River Trail in Chugach State Park.

#### **Project Timeline:**

Permitting Summer/Fall 2026 and construction Summer/Fall 2027. However, anticipating contractor delays and staffing challenges, all funds will be spent within 5 years.





The Chugach State Park Citizen Advisory Board (CSP CAB) is writing in support of the initial phase of proposed modification of the Lower Eagle River Trail connecting Access Point ER35 to the Meadow Creek Loop.

This section of trail is part of the Eagle River Greenbelt Pathway which is a proposed class 5 trail connecting the Eagle River Nature Center to the Glenn Highway (see Chugach State Park Trail Management Plan Ch 4 223a). Chugach Mountain Bike Riders has proposed:

- Building a class 3/4 trail as a phased approach to the ultimate class 5, representing a minor revision from the Chugach State Park Trail Management Plan (TMP). We believe the intent and long-term phased upgrade approach are consistent with the TMP and the Chugach State Park Management Plan. It will also be a more sustainable option and represent an improvement over the existing fall line trail.
- Building a trail connecting Access Point ER35 to Meadow Creek Loop represents a minor diversion from the Chugach State Park Trail Management Plan, however the intent is consistent with the TMP and Access Management Plan

Support from the CAB for further planning and design of this trail would be contingent upon proven community support and engagement of stakeholders to include those at access points. Also, draft documentation through a Trail Project Plan to include parking plan will be essential. Continued communication with the CSP Superintendent and CAB on these matters will ensure a successful long term trail improvement project.
